# Congratulations to our Overall Winner

## **MCK Construction**

Once a focal point in the small Scottish fishing village of Usan, just south of Montrose, this 120 year-old coastguard tower and accompanying building had fallen into disrepair by the time it was purchased by a local fisherman hoping to rescue the relic and integrate it into his family home.

Built on the exposed North Sea coast, Usan Coastguard Tower was once a lookout post and housed the local rocket rescue equipment used to recover struggling mariners in adjacent waters. Some 60 years of neglect had taken their toll however, and much of the former lookout balcony had rotted away; making this a truly unique project requiring incredible skill, attention to detail and remarkable vision. Luckily, award-winning chartered architect and university lecturer Garry Adam was on-hand, and together with local Master Builder MCK Construction, they set about restoring this once proud landmark to its former glory.

Naturally, given the structure's heritage, MCK Construction had to consult regularly with the planning department throughout the project to ensure as much of its original character was preserved as possible. What's more, a lack of access roads meant the site was only accessible through an adjacent field, complicating an already challenging task that was overcome through the goodwill of the neighbouring farmer.

Aiming to exceed the already stringent Scottish building standards concerning U-values and energy performance, MCK Construction used zinc cladding on the first-floor bedroom's bay window to preserve the stunning panoramic views of the Scottish coastline and the North Sea. The kitchen's dark grey zinc bay window offers a similar spectacle, with double glazing used throughout to ensure maximum solar gain for the project.

With seafront wear and tear having a pronounced effect on the original Welsh slated roof and lead finial, MCK Construction endeavoured to repoint the stonework and give the area a complete makeover. At the rear of the property a set of grand stone steps – once the entrance to the original lookout post – now leads directly to the master bedroom; adding a novel touch to this exquisite build. The garden also features a traditional drystane dyke topped with capping stones, offering an excellent opportunity for outdoor entertaining during those balmy sunny days of summer.

The extension features a timber frame structure with large gable glazing, maintenance-free cement cladding, a zinc standing-seam roof covering and rainwater goods, with a distinct joint between the new roof covering and the old stonework beneath clearly marking where new joins old in this perfect combination of traditional and modern.

The property is a truly spectacular build that demonstrates the tremendous skill and efficiency exercised by this builder. Contending with a highly unorthodox build in a challenging environment, MCK Construction has delivered a one-of-a-kind build to an exceptional standard; befitting the Master Builder badge of quality.







Spey Building & Joinery Ltd

The location of this off-the-grid building site is to remain one of Spe

The location of this off-the-grid building site is to remain one of Spey Building & Joinery Ltd's best-kept secrets in accordance with their client's wishes, and because there are few spots of natural beauty like this left to enjoy.

Naturally then, the new home project delivered by Spey Building & Joinery Ltd had to be equally as beautiful. The principle objective for this new home was to create accommodation and a separate workspace that blended with. and complemented, the stunning countryside surroundings. By using sustainable and locally sourced materials coupled with low-impact construction techniques, the integrity of the site was protected with minimum disturbance to the nearby peaty landscape.

The workforce lived locally throughout to cut down on transport costs to site and overcame unpredictable weather conditions as well as significant access restrictions along a steep, rough-access track to get the materials to site.

Spey Building & Joinery Ltd implemented several special features to give this home its own distinct identity, including Scottish larch cladding, which was charred in order to change the molecular structure of the timber and enhance its weather resistance – a much needed attribute in this remote corner of the world. In addition, the team also installed solar thermal and PV panels as well as inverters, batteries, and wood stoves with thermal stores to

ensure the remote property would be self-sufficient.

The sheer volume of cladding produced for the exterior walls and all the various roof angles was a truly impressive feat, amounting to 10 kilometres of 70mm-diameter boarding. This tremendous undertaking led Spey Building & Joinery Ltd to build their own 2.5m kiln onsite - complete with gas torches - to produce the cladding; demonstrating incredible ingenuity and capability on their part.

Spey Building & Joinery Ltd delivered this technically and logistically challenging build in a way few others ever could; demonstrating the concept of building better in majestic fashion.

Mister & Missus Ltd undertook this comprehensive restoration and extension of a three-storey townhouse originally built in 1846 and owned by the same family for more than 60 years.

The property was beginning to show its age and was more or less derelict by the time work began. While the structure itself was beautifully proportioned, it had undergone a great deal of superficial work and an extension carried out during the 1960s had removed some of the original features, with the owners also adding a staircase and a bedsit in the basement.

The client wanted to restore the property's 19<sup>th</sup> century charm and create a sociable space with modern amenities; Mister & Missus Ltd didn't disappoint.

The original brief called for the demolition and rebuilding of a wing of the house, but thanks to the team's clever thinking and an inventive idea to support the concrete pad with thin strips of carbon fibre, resin-bonded to the concrete, a costly and wasteful demolition was avoided.

The team began with a mansard roof extension and added to the existing ground floor extension. Then, following a stroke of genius

and some design changes, added a fourth floor to the closet wing extension; making it the first on the street to keep the wing subordinate but equal to the four floors of the main house. This added real value to a home with limited space where every square foot makes a difference.

Mister & Missus Ltd arranged regular site visits for their clients and maintained excellent communication throughout the project, with brief minutes and agreements also sent through email. They endeavoured to keep the budget tracked and updated fortnightly, helping to ensure peace of mind for a very happy client.

## Medium Renovation Project C1 Construction & Development Services Ltd

The house was part of a probate sale and was empty for two years prior to work starting, meaning it was in a dilapidated state and required a complete renovation with a side and rear extension.

C1 Construction & Development Services Ltd stripped the building down to the brickwork, then rewired and re-plumbed the property before installing new thermal ash parquet flooring throughout.

The team proceeded to restore and re-cove the original fireplaces, install new box sash windows, rework the façade and reconstruct the Victorian pathway before turning attention to the staircase and wall-panelling. Finally, a marble bathroom and a modern kitchen were added to complete a highly comprehensive build that reinvigorated the property.

C1 Construction & Development Services Ltd agreed a fixed price with their client prior to starting the project and scheduled regular on-site walkthroughs at the weekends to discuss progress. Aiming to create two separate but complementary family homes with their own special character and specifications, StuartBarr CDR Ltd worked closely with their highly environmentally conscious clients to put together an effective eco-build despite planning restrictions.

StuartBarr CDR Ltd endeavoured to maximise the recycling of reclaimed materials from the initial demolition and thereby minimise greenhouse gas emissions from new manufacturing and subsequent transportation. The team also worked to make the new build as airtight as possible and implemented the very best eco-technology heating solutions and waste disposal facilities. The team tackled the challenge posed by cold bridges in the concrete and steel frame of the building by adding an extra 50mm of insulation and a high-quality vapour control layer around the affected areas. The use of

2.5 kWp solar photovoltaic panels also stand to save the clients hundreds of pounds every year in energy bills.

This was a highly collaborative build between expert clients and a true Master Builder, where both parties shared a passion for sustainable construction. Despite challenges associated with the initial plan, a strong client-builder relationship meant that environmental considerations at Mayfield Barn remained paramount throughout the project, resulting in the creation of a truly sustainable family home for decades to come.

From floor to ceiling the offices measure an impressive 2.8 metres, increasing to 3.65 metres on the ground floor and with 200 square metres of extensively planted biodiverse roofing to further enhance the building's sustainability factor.

and bath without issue and avoiding combining the two fixtures at the client's request. They also created additional storage space by incorporating the shelving within the tiled walls, ensuring optimal positioning which didn't infringe upon the use of any of the bathroom utilities.

## Large Renovation Project MCK Construction

MCK Construction restored the 120-year-old Usan Coastguard Tower in Scotland, resurrecting a local landmark abandoned some 60 years ago.



The company rose to the challenge of renovating the property as a modern home and worked closely with the planning department to ensure the refurbishment works retained as much of the building's original character as possible.

Situated on the North Sea coast, the tower sits in a remote location with no road serving the site, which meant all materials and access had to be delivered via temporary access through a neighbouring farmer's field. The existing tower still featured the original Welsh slated roof with a lead finial, the lookout balcony had largely rotted away and, being so close to the sea, the stonework had to be repointed and given a general makeover.

The new extension consists of a timber frame structure with large gable glazing, maintenance-free cement cladding and a zinc standing-seam roof covering. The joint between the new roof covering and the old stonework denotes where new joins old. A zinc-clad projecting bay window to the first floor bedroom, and a similar feature in the lounge, give residents a panoramic view over the rocky shoreline and the continually changing faces of the North Sea.

This is a spectacular build requiring great skills to transform the dilapidated property into a modern family home with stunning views of the coastline.

## Local Authority / Public Sector Project Lowry Building & Civil Engineering Ltd

Lowry Building & Civil Engineering Ltd secured the national Local Authority / Public Sector award for building two state-of-the-art surgical theatres in an internal courtyard space within Altnagelvin Area Hospital in Northern Ireland.



The builder effectively managed the significant risks associated with carrying out construction in a live hospital environment with operational wards and busy clinics in close vicinity to the construction works. In addition, the team observed strict infection control procedures throughout the project and successfully negotiated the challenges posed by the hospital's sole access route on the main road.

Lowry Building & Civil Engineering
Ltd committed to delivering
materials to the site via an overhead
crane to avoid the risks associated
with moving building materials
through the hospital itself, and
used out-of-hours scheduling to
minimise disruption and prioritise
the needs of staff and patients.
An existing prefabricated unit

was also demolished and removed to make room for the new theatre's steel frame and a total renovation of the surrounding area of the hospital.

The team fully integrated themselves into the daily operation of the hospital to better understand and adapt building works to the daily activities on the ward. The client was informed through weekly meetings, which also ensured that upcoming construction and healthcare activities could be aligned and building works remained on track.

The two state-of-the-art surgical theatres built by Lowry Building & Civil Engineering Ltd are the first of their kind at Altnagelvin Area Hospital.

City Lofts London came to the rescue of a client in distress; taking on a "house of horrors" that many builders would have walked away from and treating the client with outstanding care.

The client had been failed by solicitors, a surveyor and cowboy builders and in addition to the serious structural integrity issues, the property had an illegally built loft structure.
